Dr Charanjit Singh Aulakh joined Punjab Agricultural University in 1995 and served in various capacities as Agronomist. He was elevated to the position of Director, School of Organic Farming in 2017 and to Dean, College of Agriculture in 2023. He has 28-year extensive experience in teaching, research, extension and administration. He taught various undergraduate and graduate courses, guiding three PhD and ten MSc students as their major advisor. He has to his credit seven books, two teaching manuals and 18 book chapters. He has been Secretary of Alumni Association, College of Agriculture; Coordinator of College Placement Cell and President of PAU-INSPIRE Club.

Dr Aulakh has handled several externally funded research projects in the field of organic farming, Good Agricultural Practices and Integrated Farming System. He has developed 50 production technologies on various crops/cropping systems, Organic Farming, Integrated Integrated Farming System(IFS), vermicomposting, Nutrient Management, weed management, bio fertilizers and zero tillage. He has published 71 research papers, two review papers, five conference papers, and two invited papers. He has received three best Research Centre team awards, three best paper presentation awards and one best research paper award. He organised 52 training programs and facilitated three certificate courses. Additionally, he shared his expertise through 49 invited lectures, 249 training lectures, and 46 appearances on TV and radio. Moreover, he contributed to knowledge dissemination by publishing 81 extension articles and crafting six extension folders. He attended 132 international and national seminars/workshops including four in Philippines, The Netherlands, Mauritius, and Switzerland. As Director of the School, he was instrumental in getting two DBT and one DST funded projects; signed MOU with FiBL, Switzerland; established 'PAU-Organic Farmers' Club' and PAU-Aromatic & Spice Growers' Club, and developed 'PAU SAFEFOOD Production Practices' certification programme for certified safe food production. He has been expert member on different committees of ICAR, DST, CSIR and PHDCCI.

Ms Neema, an acclaimed international pugilist, has a distinguished record of representing India with remarkable success. An alumna of Guru Gobind Singh College for Women and Panjab University, Chandigarh, she first delved into the world of boxing during her college years. Her journey in the sport took off when she clinched gold in her very first bout, igniting a passion for boxing that would grow immensely over time. She clinched the gold medal an impressive seven times, both in Chandigarh Senior State Women Boxing Championship and Inter-College Competitions. Neema continued her medal haul with Silver medals in All India inter-university boxing (women) tournament in 2017 as well as 2018. Additionally, she showcased her talent by participating in the Elite Women's National Boxing Championship from 2016 to 2020. She won the bronze medal in both the 5th and 6th editions of the Elite (Senior) Women's National Boxing Championship in 2021 and 2022, held in Hisar and Bhopal respectively.

In addition to her impressive achievements in her sport, she has also demonstrated excellence in her academic pursuits. In 2020-2021, she completed her Diploma in Sports Coaching (Boxing) from NSNIS, Patiala, earning an A grade and obtained her Masters in Physical Education from Panjab University, Chandigarh in 2019, graduating with distinction. In 2022, Neema's prowess shone brightly as she garnered the Bronze medal medal in International Elite Men and Women Boxing Tournament 'Elorda Cup,' held at Kazakhstan, in 2022 and 2023. She now serves as Boxing Coach at Chandigarh Sports Council. Her journey is a testament to the discipline and focus sports can instil, and she stands as an inspirational figure for the youth, advocating the value of sports in building character and resilience.

Academic Courses

Affiliated to Panjab University, Chandigarh, the College offers Post Graduate Courses in Commerce, Economics and English; Undergraduate Courses in Commerce, Sciences (Non-Med/ Comp Sc), Computer Science & Applications and Humanities. A total number of 1577 students were enrolled in the current session for different programmes of study.

Infrastructure

The sprawling 11-acre campus is replete with an expanse of infrastructure which includes the latest facilities with three- storeyed Arts, Science and Commerce Blocks with spacious and well-equipped classrooms and smart classrooms. A ramp connects all blocks to the ground floor offering easy access to the physically challenged.

The College has well-equipped laboratories in the Departments of Physics, Chemistry, Computer Science, Functional English, Psychology, Home Science, Music, and Fine Arts. The College library is spacious, fully automated with Campus Whizz ERP software, centrally air-conditioned, equipped with INFLIBNET database. The Learning Resource Centre facilitates the students in their research-oriented activities. The library also has a Braille Corner with NVDA (Non-Visual Digital Access) software for visually challenged students.

The College houses a Research Lab, an air- conditioned Seminar Room, and Mata Ganga Auditorium. The College boasts a large sports ground with a multipurpose track, Mata Gujri Fitness Centre, an open air gym and expansive grounds for students.

The Students' Centre is housed with Canteen- cum-Cafeteria, a Stationery Shop along with Photostat Facility. Also located in the College is a fully functional SBI Branch exclusively for the benefit of students and College employees. The College takes pride in its landscape gardens set near the main building with smooth lawns and beds of perennials which augment the beauty of the campus. The College has Campus-wide Wi-Fi Facility, 24x7 CCTV Surveillance and 24x7 Power Supply and Generator Facility.

College Library

For nearly half a century, the College has been dedicated to delivering excellent education to its students and has consistently worked on developing and improving its infrastructure to support effective teaching and learning. The modernized library, managed by Ms Sukhdeep Kaur, the Librarian, along with her committed team members Mr Jaspreet Singh, the Library Assistant, and Ms Gagandeep Kaur, the Library Restorer, plays a pivotal role. The energetic and passionate staff is focused on ensuring the seamless operation of the library.


The College Library has a Blog (<u>https://ggscwlibrary.blogspot.com/</u>) which serves as a digital platform for students to access a variety of resources including previous years question papers, pages/links showcasing staff and student achievements, newspaper clippings, the latest Panjab University syllabus, and links to various open-access eresources, among other offerings. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the Library launched Gyankosh: An Institutional repository, where faculty members contributed recorded electures in formats such as PPTs, audio/video lectures, and PDFs, accessible through the Blog, marking the beginning of a continuous practice. Embracing an Open Access system, the Library encourages users to expand their knowledge base. With a collection boasting over 24,450+ books and 490+ CDs covering diverse subjects, including Reference Books, Coffee Table Books, and light reading materials such as Fiction, Self-help, and Biographies, the Library caters to varied interests. Additionally, the Library subscribes to 9 magazines, 2 Journals, and 6 newspapers on an annual basis. With more than 2000 books across subjects, the college library is a treasure trove for students. It became their mainstay during the pandemic with its annual borrowing privileges that supported them through the academic year. Fresh arrivals are showcased on a designated display stand, complemented by an LED board highlighting Library services and new acquisitions.

The Library operates seamlessly with the integration of the Campus Whizz ERP software, ensuring efficient management of its resources. An outstanding feature of the library is the Learning Resource Centre located on the first floor, providing students with enhanced facilities for research-oriented activities. Additionally, the Library accommodates a Braille Corner equipped with a computer installed with NVDA (Non Visual Digital Access) software tailored for visually impaired individuals. The college subscribes to e-books and e-Journals through the NLIST programme of INFLIBNET, UGC. A dedicated reading room is provided for students to peruse their personal documents and books in peace. Furthermore, every year, newly enrolled students are introduced to the Library's services and amenities through the orientation programme, ensuring they are well-acquainted with the resources available to them.



Activities

An online Workshop-cum-Hands-on Training Session was organized by the College Library on June 19, 2023. The workshop focused on "QuillBot: An Academic Writing Platform" and was facilitated by Mr Aman Jain, a Business Development Specialist from QuillBot. Mr. Jain provided a comprehensive overview of the various features of QuillBot and also demonstrated its functionality through hands-on training for the participants.



The workshop saw the active participation of over 100 attendees.

The college library hosted a Bookmark Competition, aimed at providing students with a platform to nurture creativity, promote reading, and cultivate artistic skills. 63 students participated in the competition. Mehak of BCA II, won the first prize, second prize bagged by Anjali of BA II and Subah Kaushal of BA II and Ruchi Singh of BCom II won the third prize. Consolation prize was won by Deepika Thakur of BCom II.





The Library and Research Cell of the college organised a Workshop on 'Significance of e-**Resources** in Teaching, Learning and on September 13, 2023. Research' The resource person, Dr Neeraj Kumar Singh, Deputy Librarian, A C Joshi Library, Punjab University, Chandigarh conducted the workshop along the parameters of search strategy, e-resources at Panjab University library, searching beyond Google and e-Learning platforms. Faculty, post graduate as well as undergraduate students participated in the workshop.

Mata Kheevi Hostel



The College has a well-equipped Hostel offering accommodation to 300 residents and catering to four SES institutions. There is a Gurudwara Sahib within the Hostel premises, which offers sanctum to students. Periodic renovation of the Hostel is undertaken to ensure comfort and hygiene levels to the residents. Facilities like laundry, Common Room, Visitors' Room and LCDs are provided.

Scholarships and Concessions





These discussions addressed the pressing challenges posed by urbanization, economic development, and the urgency of mitigating climate change effects; balancing ecosystem. The seminar witnessed an overwhelming response from both faculty and students of the college, reflecting a genuine interest and concern among the academic community for the critical issues discussed.

Two representatives from our club delivered speeches highlighting the significance of youth in national development. The purpose of the event was to inspire and educate young individuals about the decision-making process.

The District Installation Ceremony was hosted on August 12, 2023, by the District Rotaract Organization of Rotary International District 3080 at Hotel Classic Regency Pinjore. The aim of the activity was to acquaint students with the process of fostering positive change in their environment by addressing both physical and social needs. Three representatives from the club attended the event.

The club organized Wabi Sabi, a fundraising event, from August 28-31, 2023. The event was held at Guru Gobind Singh College for Women, Chandigarh. Additionally, two stalls were set up by the club: one for games and the other for hair braiding and tattoo making. The event successfully raised funds aimed at supporting underprivileged children in the slum area of Chandigarh sector 25. These funds were utilized in stationary campaigns.

Placement Cell

The Placement Cell of the college operates round the year to facilitate job opportunities as well as internships to the final year students of the college. It serves as an interface between the Students and the Corporate. Companies are invited from various fields in order to make range of opportunities available for the students of all courses.

The Placement Cell has had fruitful year of placements and internships as several companies visited the campus for the recruitment drive.

The Placement Cell organised an On-Campus Placement Drive on February 23-March 28, 2024.

On February 23, 2024 eClerks Services Ltd. visited the college campus for placements. Around 150 students registered for the drive. The selection process for eClerks Services Ltd. included an HR round, assessment round, and interview round. 30 students got placed.



On March 28, 2024, Primal Housing Finance Limited visited the campus. Firstly, they conducted pre-placement drive to make the students aware regarding the process of recruitment. They were given a link for online psychometric test which was the prior requirement for selection in the company. As many as 70 students appeared for the test and 55 students qualified the same. Finally, 53 students were selected for the job.

The Placement Cell also organized Seminars to equip students with career guidance and to enhance their employability skills. The Placement cell organized a 96-hour Certification Program on Banking, Finance and Insurance in association with Bajaj Finserv Pvt. Ltd. to impart practical knowledge to the students from January 19-April 01, 2024. 50 students have registered for the same.

A session by Regional Centre for Entrepreneurship Development, Chandigarh was conducted on March 27, 2024 to facilitate students with soft skill programs to help then unlock their potential to enhance employability.
